From 1st April 2022, many CBA distributor members will be affected by the new Plastic Packaging Tax. This new tax will impact both UK manufacturers of plastic packaging and UK importers of plastic packaging, whether the imported packaging is unfilled or filled. This new tax of £200/tonne will apply to plastic packaging manufactured in, or imported into the UK, that does not contain at least 30% recycled plastic.

This short clinic is designed to explain:

- the packaging in scope of the new tax
- who will be impacted
- the threshold tests
- registration & reporting requirements
- how ERP can help manage the above on your behalf
